AIR Frequently Asked Questions

What is the time commitment?

Each program (working directly with students) is expected to run a minimum of 5 full school days (8 hours

per day). In addition, there will be planning time with the teacher in developing the lesson plan, planning

and purchasing supplies and in completing the fingerprinting/background check for WCS.

Will I be paid for my time?

Yes. Artists are paid a stipend dependent upon experience and duration of project. A minimum of \$750 is

paid for a 5 day project.

Who pays for the supplies?

ACWC will pay actual cost for any supplies needed $\underline{up\ to}$ \$500 for a 5 day program. Longer programs will

be negotiated.

Can I choose which school I want to work with?

Unfortunately, no. Schools and artists are paired based on the school's ability to accommodate the medium

of the artist as well as their time schedules.

Am I limited to providing only one program?

No. You may provide more than one program or work with the same program in more than one school.

Please provide a separate proposal for each different program and indicate in the availability section if you

are open to working with more than one school.

Do I have to be fingerprinted?

Yes. Williamson County Schools requires that all persons working directly with students clear a background

check and be fingerprinted.

Will I have to pay for the fingerprinting?

No. ACWC will pay for your fingerprinting/background check.

Do I have to be a member of ACWC?

Yes. You will need to be a current member of ACWC in order to participate in the AIR program. However,

you do not need to be a current member to complete this proposal.

AIR Expectations

Artists:

- Complete ACWC AIR Proposal.
- Contact assigned teacher upon confirmation of program acceptance to schedule dates for program.
- Begin process for Tier III volunteer status through WCS website (this is required by WCS for all non-employee persons working with students in Williamson County schools. You will not be able to begin your program until this process is complete and you have been approved. (http://www.wcs.edu/volunteer/volunteer home.htm)
- Schedule a face-to-face or phone planning time with assigned teacher to develop lesson plan and secure any necessary supplies **no less than 4 weeks prior to program.**

Assigned WCS Teacher:

- Provide artist with exact dates that class can be available for program.
- Provide artist with information on available room amenities (work space, equipment, supplies, etc...).
- Be available for planning time of lesson (with artist, whether face-to-face or by phone).
- Provide artist with the finalized lesson plan (after collaboration with artist).
